Stover School

When you spend time at Stover School you can tell that it is a school on the rise, labelled 'one to watch' by The Good Schools Guide'. Pupil numbers have bucked national trends and increased by over 20%, the number of pupils achieving five or more GCSEs at A* - C has increased by from 52 to 91% in the last two years. In parallel, ALevel passes now stand at 97% of all entries.

The school has recently committed to a rolling development and investment programme to continue to improve the educational facility for all pupils. Developments include a new Sixth Form Centre, Art Studio, Music Rooms, resurfaced tennis courts and refurbished Boarding Houses.

Coming to a new country and speaking a new language can be an exciting and fulfilling experience. Learning a language is an on-going process and, of course, it is only natural that it takes time to adjust.

We aim to help our International students develop their knowledge of English and their ability to use the English language, while simultaneously making a direct contribution to the pupils' general confidence and social development.

The aim of this week's programme is to help you settle in and become more familiar with your new environment. In lessons, we will go over some practical and useful vocabulary that you will be able to use immediately. You will also get to know some of your fellow pupils, and teachers – and learn some practical information that will let you 'hit the ground running' when term starts.

Learners are taught in small class groups, based on a pupil's age and ability, which help pupils to improve their spoken and written English language.

Opportunities are also offered to visit places of interest that are both enjoyable and fun, in order to be completely immersed in the

Throughout the school we offer a broad and balanced curriculum that recognises natural






AS & A Level Results

Examination Results

97% of all A Level entries achieved A* - E grades, up from 84% in 2014, with 38% of grades at B and above.

Of the pupils sitting GCSE examinations, 77% achieved 5 GCSE examinations graded C and above, including English and Mathematics. This is an improvement of more than 25% in the two years since the arrival of new head, Richard Notman. Over 60% of the grades achieved were at B and above. The school is particularly proud that this cohort produced 76.6 grades above their standardised predictions, giving an average Value Added performance of 3.5 grades per pupil.

These examination results are a direct result of the dedication of both pupils and staff, our research based learning focus and the success centred methods the school uses to measure academic performance; consequently for the last two years all our Sixth Form pupils have gained places at universities of their choice. In the same 2 year period the school roll has increased by over 20%. The variety of facilities, specialised staff and small class approach allows pupils to receive the highest standards of pupil focused teaching which develop their understanding, and independence.

Richard Notman, Headmaster of Stover School, said: "The real satisfaction in these results is seeing how our broad academic programme allows young people with a variety of abilities to achieve and follow their dreams. Whether heading off to a Russell Group university or taking a place in vocational training, our pupils add value to their expected outcomes and I am delighted to be giving them such good news."

School is about helping to prepare young people for life. While good academic grades are a very important part of this, the ability to communicate effectively, to empathise with others and the confidence to believe you can achieve anything you want to are just as important. At Stover School our holistic curriculum creates strong personal development which drives success in achieving placements at university, college or in the workplace. I would like to congratulate all pupils and staff.

Boarding at Stover

About 15% of the Stover School community are boarders. There are two separate Boarding Houses on the campus: Mansion House and Park House. Each House has a slightly different format of age groups, and each has its own sense of individuality; whilst at the same time working in unity with the other Houses in order to create a whole boarding community.

We have a unique range of boarding options on offer here including full, weekly, flexi and occasional boarding. Boarding pupils develop

strong, lifelong and supportive friendships.

Houseparents and Assistant House Tutors live within the Boarding Houses, Both Houses offer a safe and secure environment for our boarders, where pupils act with courtesy and consideration towards each other.

Both Boarding Houses now have cohorts in which British pupils make up the greatest percentage of the population and this coupled with the diverse spread of nationalities



amongst the overseas pupils, (18 different nationalities are represented), brings a global perspective and learning opportunity to all of our pupils.

MANSION HOUSE

Mansion House is situated within the main school building, overlooking the beautiful Dartmoor National Park.


Mansion House comprises of a mixture of rooms, both small and larger dormitories.

There is a fully equipped, open plan kitchen and common room with access to TV, DVDs and a Nintendo Wii.

PARK HOUSE

Park House is situated within the main school building overlooking the school grounds and Jubilee Hall. Park House comprises of a mixture of small and larger rooms alongside a number of single rooms.

Park House has a kitchen and common room where boarders can socialise.





Boarders' Activities

STRUCTURED ACTIVITIES

There are many activities that are run in the Boarding Houses, additional to the school-based activities.

Throughout the week boarders will have a choice of a minimum of 2 activities three times a week. The activities last for approximately 1.5 hours and include: softball, volleyball, table tennis, golf, board games, chess club, karate, netball, football, tennis, rifle range, cookery, circuits, pilates, fitness suite, knitting, crochet, photography and many others! All boarders are expected to take part.

INFORMAL ACTIVITIES

During the week there are 2 nights where we have 'open-house'. This enables the boarders to visit one another, watch films, play wii, buy snacks from the tuck shop and play music.

WEEKEND ACTIVITIES

At the weekend we make time to relax, complete unfinished homework and on at least one of the days take part in trips. We are privileged to be surrounded by the beautiful Devon countryside which allows us to walk, climb, kayak and go horse riding. We also visit local towns and the city of Exeter regularly to enjoy the theatre, restaurants, art galleries, museums and cinema. Once a term we usually go further afield to explore cultural opportunities.

During the weekend we have time to reflect in our chapel with the Chaplain, and encourage our boarders to use our 64 acres as a peaceful place during this time. British traditions such



as 'Sunday roast' are often upheld alongside other national celebrations such as Chinese New Year, Diwali and Thanksgiving.

SPORTS

Hockey, Rugby, Circuits, Netball, Football, Tennis, Cross Country, Fencing, Cricket, Rounders, Athletics, Swimming, Badminton, Golf, Volleyball, Basketball, Horse Riding, Gymnastics, Trampoline, Aerobics, Judo and Dance.

We have many local and overseas trips eg: the Ski Trip; Art trips to see London and New York Galleries; Sports trips home and abroad; Geneva science trip; Music trips; Watersports trip to France; History trip to Northern France. We also run expeditions using Camps International (eg: Tanzania and Borneo).


Boarders' Nationalities

The school has a total boarding population of 57 and this strikes a super balance from which day and boarding pupils are best placed to gain benefit. In conjunction with this, across the whole school we now have 49% boys and 51% girls.

Our boarding community comes from all over the world. Students are encouraged to learn about, understand and appreciate each other's customs, traditions and cultures. Making 'friends for life' and contacts with people from across the globe is a valuable skill for the future.

Whilst learning life skills such as tolerance and patience, pupils are well prepared for life at college or university. Independent living is encouraged within a secure environment

Immersed in a broadly English speaking environment, boarding students quickly develop an effective working knowledge of English. This is enhanced through the school's own English Language unit where they learn the grammar and words of English which is complemented by taking part in everyday life, games, outings, and communication with their fellow boarders.
