STOVER SCHOOL WELCOME

Coming to a new country and speaking a new language can be an exciting and fulfilling experience. Learning a language is an ongoing process and, of course, it is only natural that it takes time to adjust. We aim to help our international boarders develop their knowledge of English and their ability to use the English Language, whilst simultaneously making a direct contribution to pupils' general confidence and social development.

Pupils are taught in small class groups, based on their age and ability, which helps improve their spoken and written English. Opportunities are also offered to visit places of interest, in order to be completely immersed in English language and culture.

STUDYING IN THE UK

The UK is one of the best destinations to study in the world, with traditions of excellence dating back hundreds of years.

The UK has an exceptionally robust approach to academic work, together with an internationally recognised system of qualifications. Class sizes are generally smaller, allowing for individual attention through a broad range of subjects.

This academic excellence is inseparable from a culture that celebrates the individual as a whole person. However good a boarding school's academic results are, it will also be striving to create a rounded learning experience by encouraging self-expression, creativity and individuality. Success in sport, the arts and other areas is one of the ways in which a boarder's independence and confidence is built up.

Living together in a multi-age, multicultural community also helps boarders to develop qualities such as kindness, tolerance and responsibility.





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A SHORT HISTORY

Stover School was founded on it's current 64 acres of parkland in 1932 and this year the School celebrates its ninetieth year.

Stover School became fully co-educational in 2012 and now has an equal number of boys and girls. Since that time the school has expanded and there are currently over 500 pupils in the school.

Our Headmaster, Mr Richard Notman, arrived at the school in 2014, driving the school forward with a holistic approach which combines a progressive research based curriculum with a resilient moral code based on sound family and Christian principles.

This drive to provide the best education for all our pupils has seen pupil number rise, examination results improve significantly and the school being nominated for an i25 Excellence awards, as one of 25 most progressive schools in the UK.

Here at Stover School we provide an education which nurtures, inspires and prepares each pupil.

STOVER SCHOOL PASTORAL CARE



Stover School is a unique and very special place. Our boarding rooms are located in the main house, overlooking the school grounds of the beautiful Dartmoor National Park.

The grounds and facilities on offer for boarders are fantastic, providing an excellent environment in which to educate the whole person. The boarding community is relatively small (approximately 50 boarders) allowing excellent pastoral care and the development of independence. Internationalism is at the heart of what we do here, and all pupils benefit form learning about other cultures. The boarding house is internationally diverse with many nationalities represented and has an even mix between UK boarders of other nationalities.

An additional enrichment programme is offered to all boarding pupils. This ranges from educational trips, to House events and recreational outings. While recognising the value of taking time out for quiet contemplation or pure relaxation, weekends at Stover are varied and purposeful.

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STOVER SCHOOL GUARDIANS



We require all overseas boarders studying at Stover to have a guardian in the UK.

A guardian acts on behalf of the parents, attending meetings with school staff and helping communication between parents and the School. They help boarders adapt to their new life and school regulations, taking an active part in the boarder's school life.

A guardian can give help and advice over examination choices and university selection, including assistance with the completion of application forms. They keep regular contact with the boarder during term time and assist with any problems that may arise. A guardian will be available to both boarders and parents 24 hours a day in case of emergency.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGAUGE



Boarders whose first language is not English will be offered English lessons appropriate to their level and will be supported to pass an examination in English as a second language by the end of their first year at school.

Where required, learners can be offered extra tuition in order to improve their reading, writing and listening skills. More information can be obtained from the EAL section of the school website.

GCSE AND A LEVEL

GCSEs and A Levels are both two year courses.
Formal GCSE study starts at the beginning of Year 10 and A Levels start at the beginning of Year 12. Pupils are able to choose from a broad variety of subjects.
Depending on language ability most international boarders will take EAL lessons, rather than English Language and Literature.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Excellent academic results are only one aspect of Stover School. Pupils have many opportunities to explore new interests, develop talents and enhance creativity through our extensive activity programme.

At Stover, we believe that extra curricular experiences are vital to a child's development, our pupils flourish when given access to a wide variety of opportunities. Our clubs and activities programme provides an opportunity to extend learning outside the classroom with options changing each term during the school year. The clubs and activities programme is an important part of the school day and activities are offered to pupils throughout the school, delivered by specialists or our own staff.

The programme is designed to develop pupils as individuals, enrich education and help recognise talent and potential. We encourage every pupil to try a range of activities, which can lead to life-long hobbies and passions.

Pupils have the opportunity to try mandy different activities which help them gain important life skills, learn about resilience commitment and time management, raise self esteem, develop relationships and prepare for the future as well as having a lot of fun.

Clubs are changed regularly but some examples include:

Arts & crafts, clay pigeon shooting, chess club, chemistry club, choir, cricket, computer programming, dissection club, dog walking, football, golf, horse riding, lace making, LAMDA (London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art), orchestra, photography, rugby, sewing, skiing, table tennis, tennis and trail running.

OUTDOOR PURSUITS

THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARDS (DofE)

The renowned DofE Award Scheme is run at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels. Pupils can enrol for their Bronze award in Year 9 and then progress through to their Silver and Gold levels by completing a personal programme of activities in four or five sections – volunteering, physical, skills, expedition and a residential for the Gold Level. From the first day to the last it's a real adventure and pupils achieve an award that provides them with skills, confidence and a view on life that everyone is looking for, from universities to employers.

TEN TORS CHALLENGE

The close proximity of Dartmoor to our school give pupils an excellent opportunity to enjoy a range of outdoor pursuits on the moor, and by being selected to represent the school at the prestigious Ten Tors Event. There may be many challenging walks in Britain today but the Ten Tors Challenge stands alone in catering solely for young people and it is believed to be the largest and most challenging event held nationally.

The Ten Tors Challenge is organised by the British Army and takes place over a weekend in May. The teams, depending on age, face hikes of 35, 45 or 55 miles (56,72 or 88km) over the rough terrain of Dartmoor, visiting ten nominated tors in under two days. The teams must be self-sufficient, carrying all that they need to complete their route and stay out overnight safely. The weather can be changeable and success or failure depends very much on the excellent preparation and training we offer our teams.

COMBINED CADET FORCE (CCF)

At Stover School, we aim to encourage self-confidence, self-motivation and self-discipline within a safe and caring community and our Combined Cadet Force (CCF) Contingent is just one way we seek to challenge our pupils in these areas.

Our pupils benefit in a variety of ways; our staff have selected a range of training which promotes leadership, confidence, teamwork and individual resilience.

ADMISSIONS

HOW TO APPLY

Due to the size of our boarding houses we suggest that applications are made as early as possible.

We are always delighted when prospective parents and pupils arrange to visit the school before deciding if Stover is the right place for them. We know that the warmth of the greeting from all they meet, coupled with our beautiful setting, often makes the visitors choice an easy one.

Applications may be received directly from a prospective boarder's family or via an agent and initial enquiries should be accompanied by:

The prospective boarder's name and date of birth.

The boarder's nationality and a copy of their passport.

The boarder's most recent school report.

The proposed year of entry and length of period of study.

A completed registration form along with a payment of £100.

All international boarders should be competent in English and applicants must be able to prove that they had the academic potential to complete their chosen course of study.

Once all of the above has been received we will send the relevant exam papers for the pupil to sit and arrange an online interview with the Headmaster, Mr Richard Notman.

Offer and acceptance of the place

Following the marking of the exam papers and online interview, we will then be in a position to notify as to whether a place is being offered. An offer letter is sent together with a request for payment of a deposit to confirm the place. The acceptance of a place must be confirmed by the payment of a deposit and the completion of the School's acceptance form within four weeks.

PURPOSE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are designed to reward excellence and to celebrate exceptional talent. These awards take into account assessment results, a pupil's ability, potential, attitude and work ethos.

In recognition of this achievement, the scholar is offered a reduction in the fees for a designated time at Stover School. In addition, music scholars may be offered free tuition in their primary musical instruments.

Scholarship invitations are sent out to all parents who have expressed an interest.

We encourage parents who are applying for scholarships and who anticipate that they will experience difficulty in meeting the balance of the tuition fees, to also apply for one of the school's means-tested bursaries.

Details regarding bursaries are available from the Admissions Office.

SCHOLARSHIP EXPECTATIONS

All scholarships are subject to annual review, and a scholar is expected to help set high standards amongst their peers, and to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to their discipline in school. Within these guidelines, it is not necessarily obligatory for a scholar to opt for any particular academic subject in Year 12.

HOW TO FIND US

By road:

Stover is conveniently located on the A382 just outside Newton Abbot, easily accessible from the M5/M4, approximately 3 hours from the M25 London.

By rail:

A direct line from Paddington Station to Newton Abbot take 2.5 hours. A taxi to Stover from Newton Abbot station takes approximately 10 minutes.

By express coach:

The direct line from London Victoria coach station or Heathrow airport to Newton Abbot takes 4 hours.

By air:

Heathrow airport – taxi direct to school takes approximately 3.5 hours

Exeter airport – taxi direct to school takes approximately 25 minutes

Bristol airport – taxi direct to school takes approximately 1.5 hours
